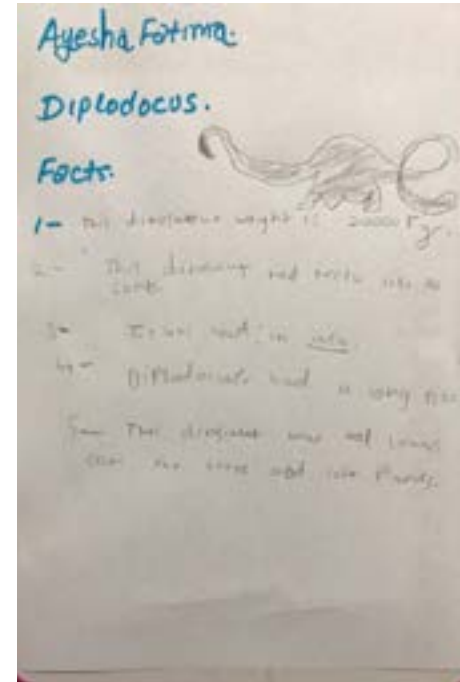

YEAR 5

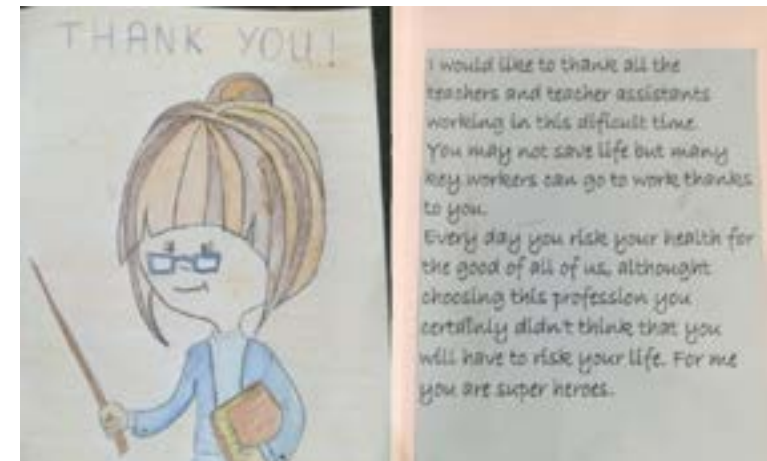
