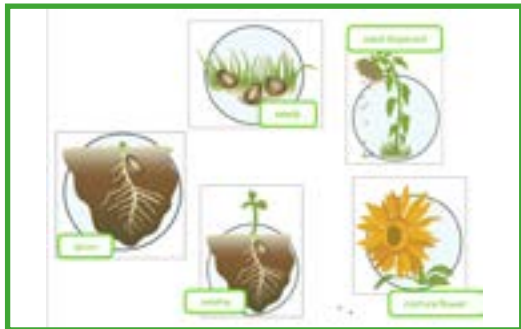
YEAR 2
